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The hidden history of People with Learning Difficulties

This exhibition explores the changing family, social and cultural history of People with Learning Difficulties in Merseyside over the past 100 years. It is part of a two-year project *People Like Us*, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund. Developed by performing and creative arts company Wicked Fish in partnership with the Museum of Liverpool, the exhibition also highlights the lives of people who were segregated from society, using information found in historic public records. It will feature personal stories from participants, oral history interviews and specially commissioned artwork.
